I urge you to direct the U.S. Forest Service to not reopen the coal mining loophole in the Colorado Roadless Rule.

This could unleash more than half a billion tons of carbon pollution--more than three years' worth of carbon emissions from all human sources in the state of Colorado.

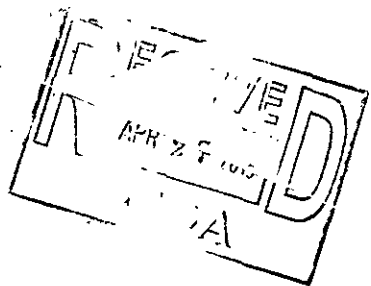

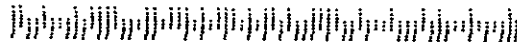
