The Roadless Rule protects 9.3 million acres of breathtaking, undeveloped roadless land in the Tongass. If the Trump administration moves forward with its plan to dismantle the Roadless Rule in the Tongass, it will endanger much of the old-growth temperate rainforest remaining on Earth.

It will also destroy the only habitat the the rare Alexander Archipelago wolves have.
