Comments:

I am against repealing the rules and opening up the Tongass National Forest to new logging. Even though I do not live in Alaska, I believe it is important to preserve the few remaining wilderness areas we have. The forest is also important to many Alaskans as a source of the food and water they need to survive, as well as income from tourism, and the billion dollar salmon industry.

Since research has shown up to 66% of the most valuable trees in the forest have already been harvested, and loggers would have to go through a lot of low value trees to get to the remaining ones, opening the forest to additional logging does not make much sense.
