B"H I concur with the March 2019 comments of Dick Artley. The proposal is breaking a number of laws. It is disadvantageous to migratory birds, decommissions roads without restoring them to their original wilderness value, justifies clearcutting where for the needs of ecological stability partial cutting should be done, does not specify any plan to re-plant with the sane native tree species, and permits the environmentally destructive and weather-hazardous practice of burning to clear the area. Needs of local natives are ignored. The proposal authorizes logging roads that will not only cut, more, across wild areas, which is very bad for wildlife, but also will cost taxpayers a lot of money, which has not been elucidated in the proposal. It is a huge project and will doubtlessly degrade the environment and surrounding ecosystems and thus affect human habitability of this and adjacent areas. The project has not been thought through and is not prudent.
