REC-080302-22-01 Lake Conasauga Recreation Area GA This project includes maintenance and rehabilitation of existing assets associated with the Lake Conasauga Recreation Area. There are improvements and a replacement of one asset which would then include both decommissioning, and new construction.

Not sure how the public can know what the above unnamed asset is referring to.

Most of the people that go to Lake Conasauga already know that the Forest Service Employee in charge of that area broke the water in the lower loop when they replace the culverts into each camp site. He pulled them up with a tractor and broke the pipes. The water has been broken in the bottom loop for FOUR YEARS. Out of 4 locations to get water in the lower loop, only the upper location by the bathroom works.

What the public really wants to know is WHY was the Forest Service Employee allowed to bury the water pipes he broke before he fixed them?

He saw where he broke them as he pulled them up with the culverts. Where was his Leadership? Is this position not supervised at any level? Why is it still not resolved after FOUR YEARS.

Elderly people have a hard time walking up to the bathrooms to get water. This causes a health risk for them to be carrying water containers and walking down the hill. Someone needs to be considerate and have some compassion for the older folks that use the campground and the others as well.

The same Forest Service employee left garbage in all the trash cans through all last closed season that caused the Bear population to be an issue when the campground opened. Someone could have been injured.

The public really want the water spickets fixed but more importantly want the root cause of the breakages at Lake Conasauga to be identified and resolved so it is not a constant problem for the future.
